



Greetings, this is John Severson, the travel agent for the Landmark “Structural Connections” course at the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel in Banff, Canada. This letter is to provide you with the information you need to book your flights and spa treatments. TRAVEL INFORMATION

Plan to have your flight arrive at Banff Calgary International Airport (YYC) **NO LATER THAN 1:30 P.M.** on Mar. 29, 2006 and depart **NO EARLIER THAN 1:30 P.M.** on April 4, 2006. If you need assistance with flight reservations, make your flight request on the “Vacation Information Form” and fax it to us at (626) 449-2811, or mail it in the envelope provided. You can also fill out the form on line at: www.acruisworld.com/landmark. We will contact you regarding the best flights to Calgary. Your roundtrip ground transportation between the Calgary International Airport and the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel is included. Please enter your flight details on the “Vacation Information Form.”

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Proof of citizenship is required when you travel to Canada. For U.S. citizens, have either a valid passport or a birth certificate (or certified copy). A birth certificate must be accompanied by official photo identification, such as a valid driver's license.

Non-U.S. citizens who have previously been admitted to the United States for permanent residence must carry their passport and Alien Registration Receipt Card, Form 1-151. Resident aliens not in possession of this form should obtain one at the nearest office of the U.S. Immigration Service. All other non-U.S./non-Canadian citizens must have valid passports and any necessary visas. Such passengers should verify the existing identification requirements for their particular travel situation as these requirements may change.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Included in your tuition is the following: the course, six (6) nights hotel accommodations (based on double occupancy - single supplement charge of \$700 available on a limited basis), roundtrip transportation from the Calgary airport, one spa treatment lasting 50 minutes at the Willow Stream Spa, and a dining credit which can be used at your leisure for six breakfasts and five dinners. Lunches are not included.

HOTEL INFORMATION

The Fairmont Banff Springs, 2km (1 mi) south of downtown Banff, is the town's architectural showpiece and a National Historic Site. Built in 1888, the hotel is easily recognized by its castle like exterior. Heritage hall, a small, free museum above the Grand Lobby, highlights the natural and cultural history of the area

through rotating exhibits. Banff Springs has been a symbol of Rocky Mountain magnificence for more than a century.

ACTIVITIES

Banff has a multitude of winter activities ranging from dog sledding to star gazing. Skiers will marvel at the natural beauty of Fairmont's Canadian ski destinations. Ragged peaks, high cliffs, and impossibly blue lakes overlaid by snowy blankets that dazzle in the bright sunlight. Whether it is the drama of the Rocky Mountains in Banff and Lake Louise, the rolling Laurentians of Tremblant and Charlevoix- skiing with Fairmont guarantees you a rewarding experience. The three extraordinary ski areas are Mount Norquay Ski, Sunshine Village, and Lake Louise Ski Area
